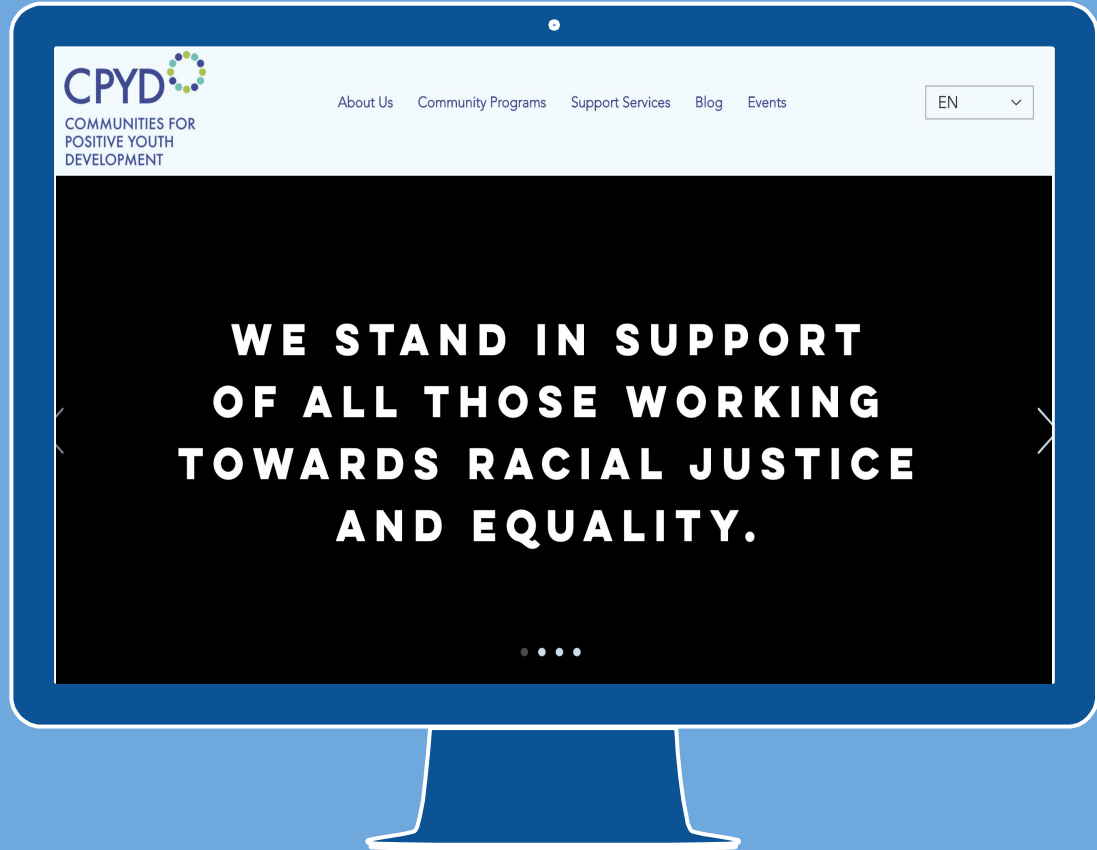



We also provide training to schools, businesses, and other organizations.

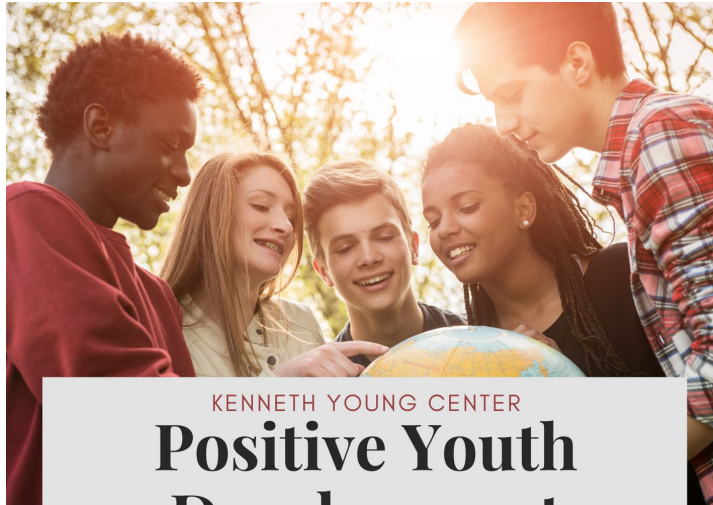

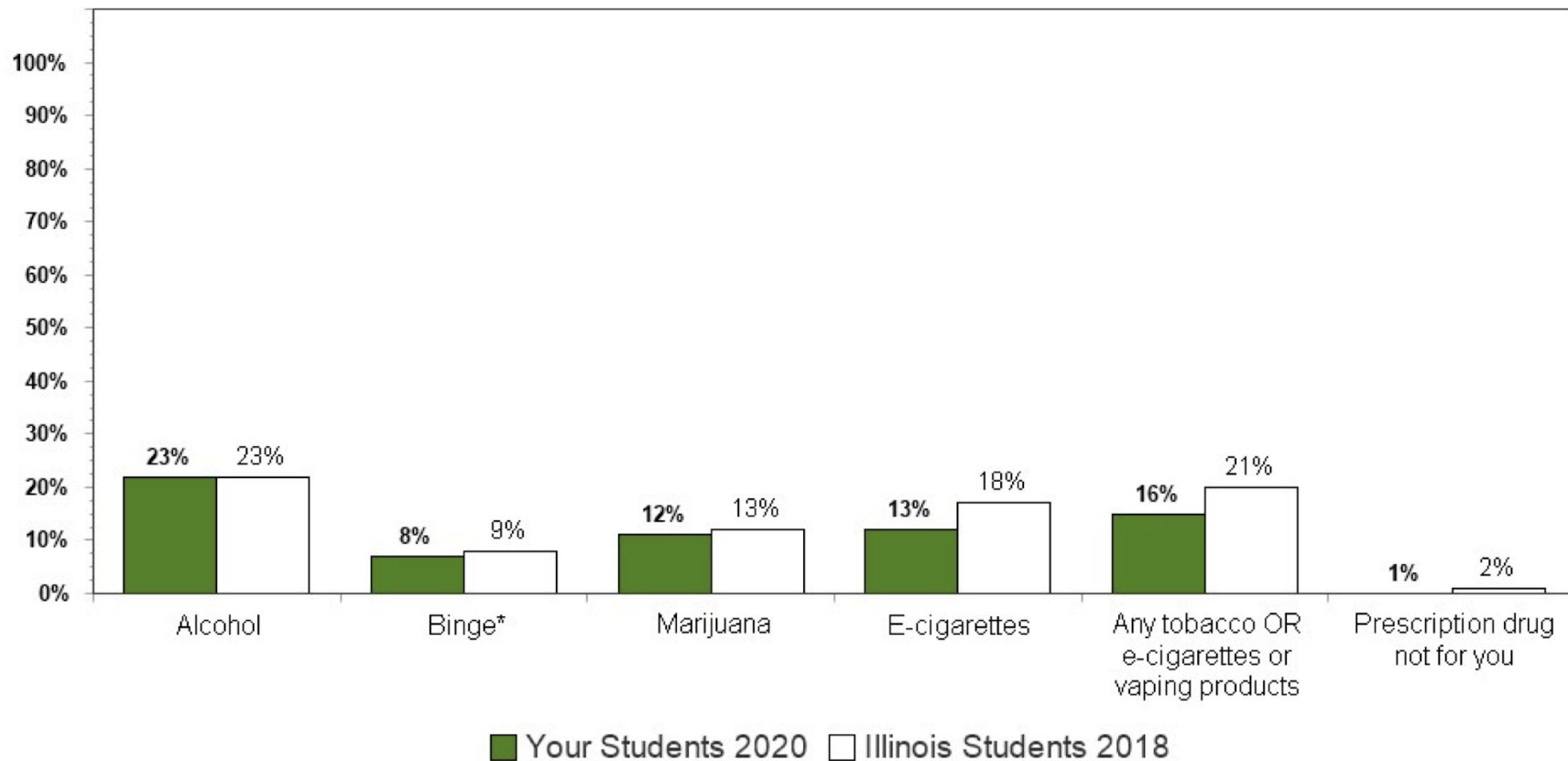

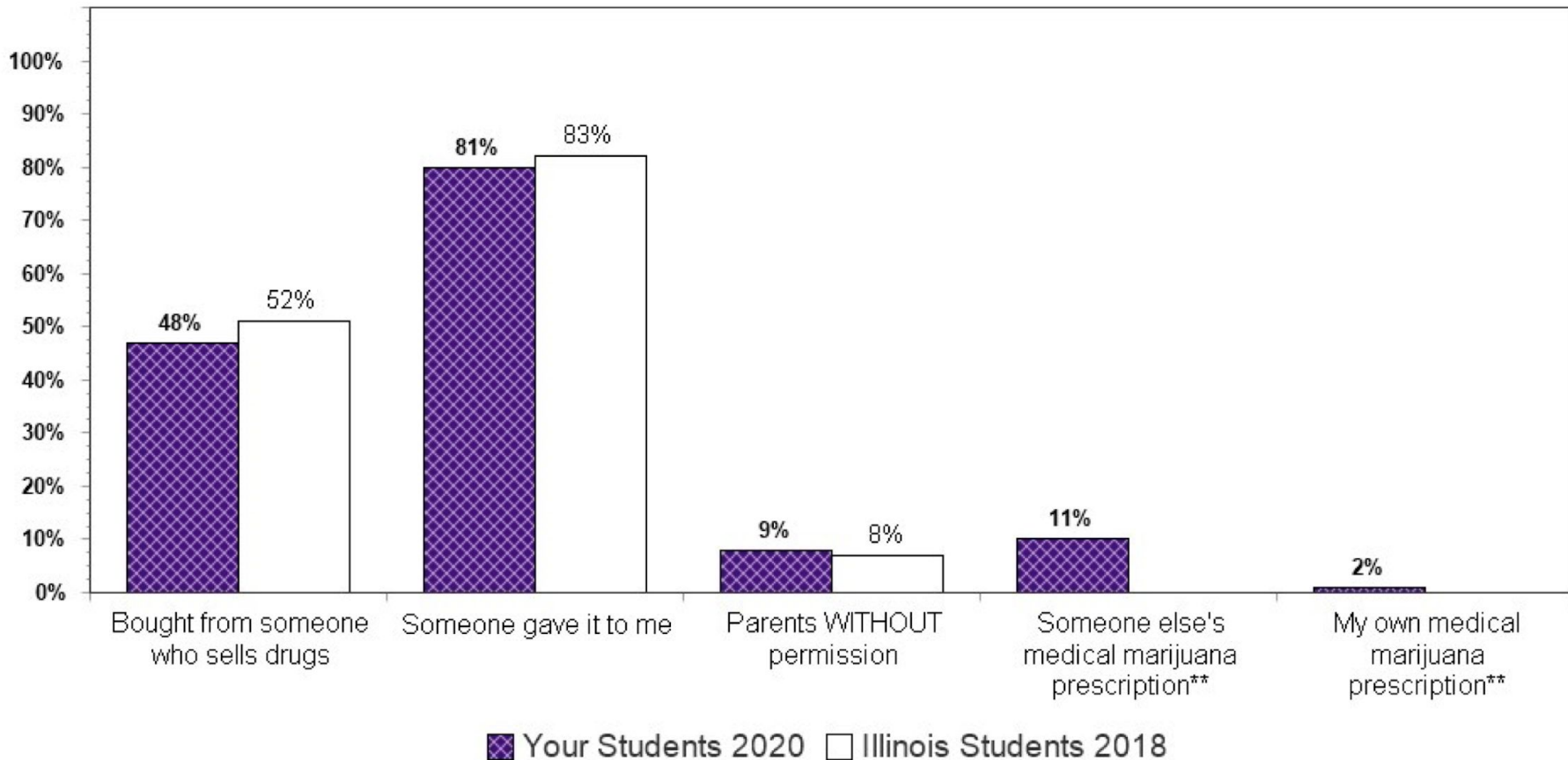

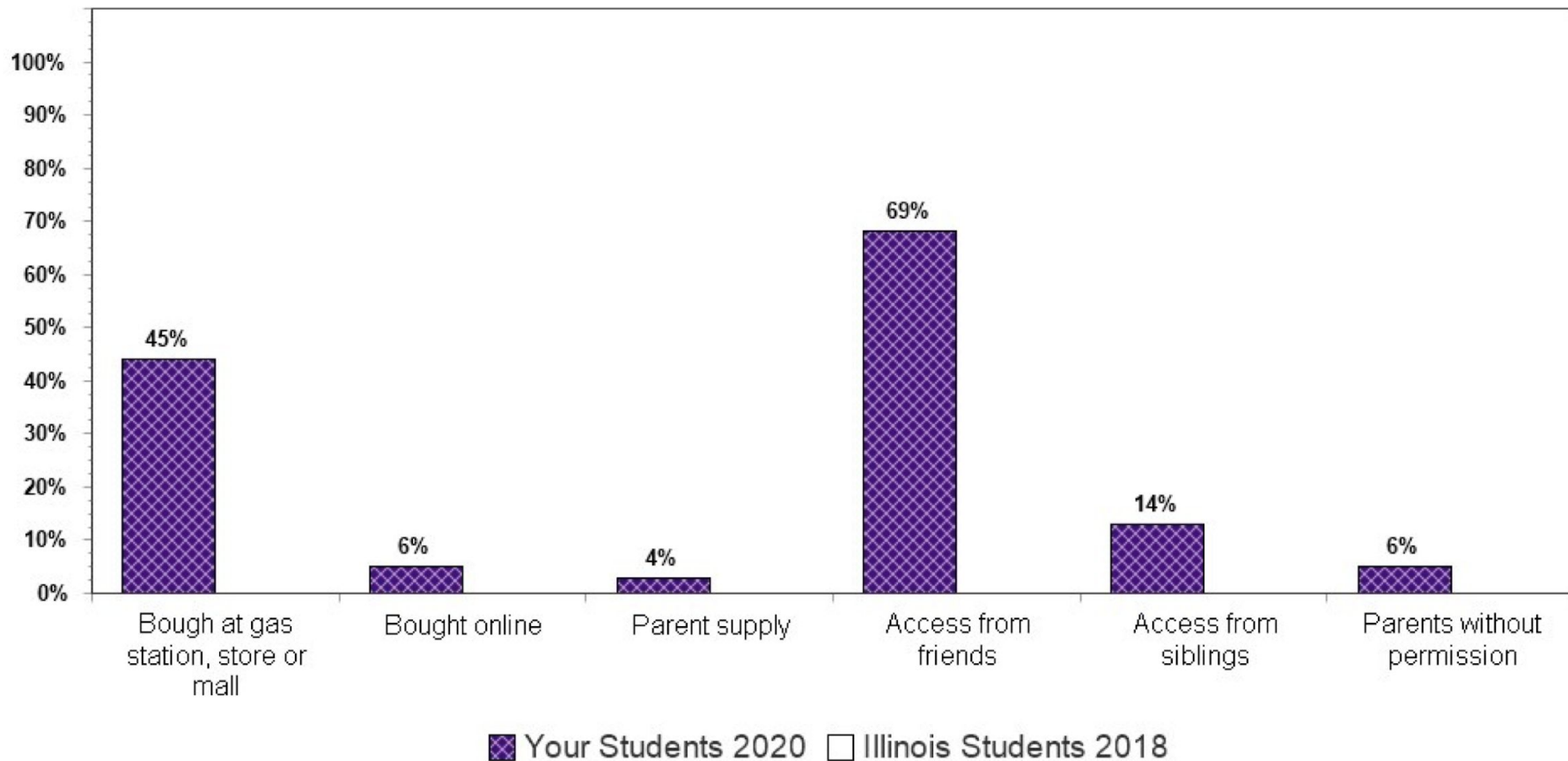
Substance Use in the Past 30 Days Among 10th Grade Youth

Source of E-Cigarettes or Other Vaping Products in the Past Year Among 12th Grade E-Cigarettes or Other Vaping Products Users*

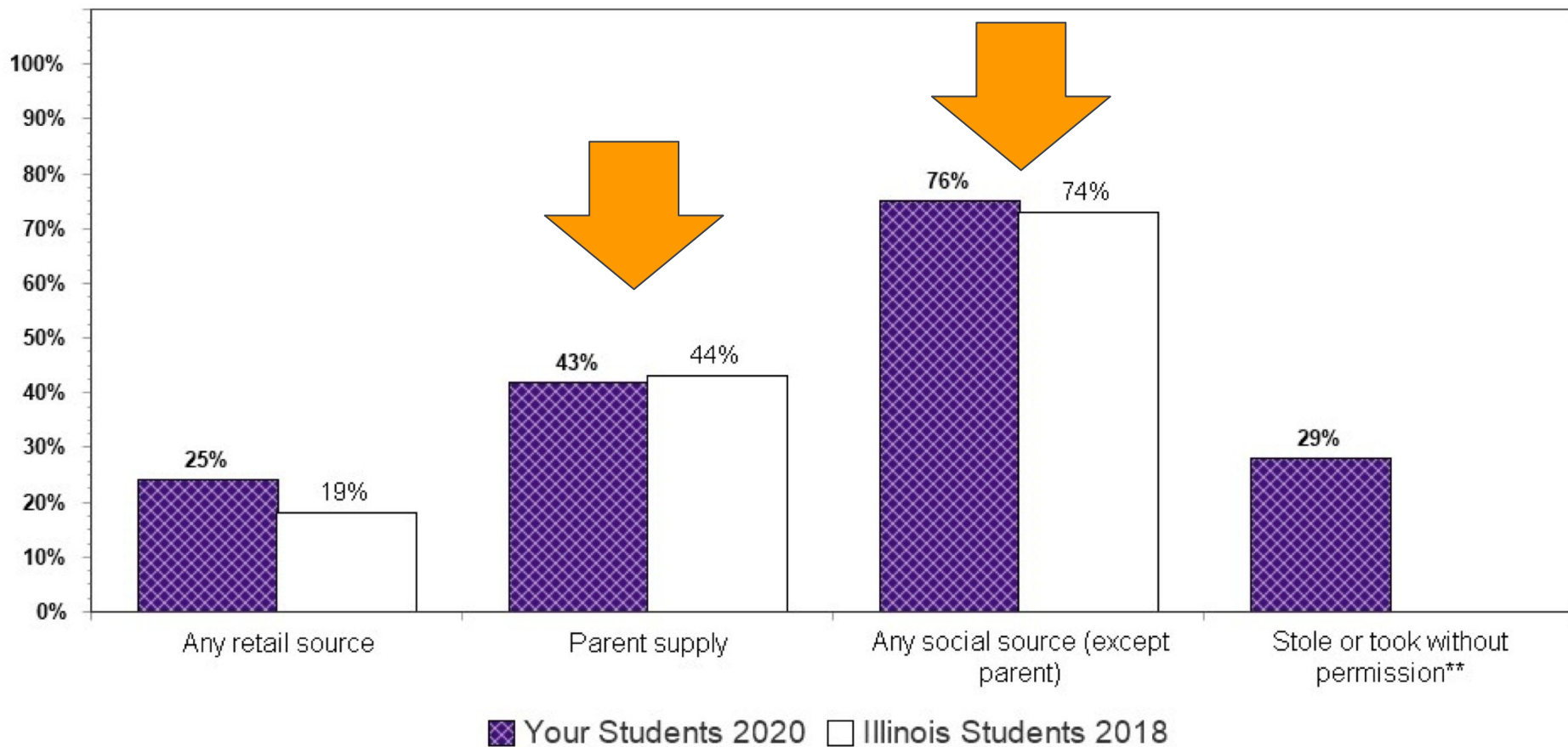
